INITIATION:

Baptism: Sacrament of welcoming into the church community. We receive the Holy Spirit and begin to share Jesus' new life. During the celebration the priest or deacon pours water over the head of the person being baptized and prays, "I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit." From the Rite of Baptism

Confirmation: Strengthens the new life we received at Baptism and helps us tell everyone the good news about Jesus. During the celebration the bishop or priest lays his hand on the head of the one to be confirmed and anoints the forehead with holy oil as he prays, "Be sealed with the Gift of the Holy Spirit." From the Rite of Confirmation

Eucharist: Celebrates the presence of Jesus in the bread and wine we share. During the celebration the priest says the words of consecration over the bread and wine, which becomes the body and blood of Christ.

HEALING:

Reconciliation: Celebrates God's healing and forgiveness of our sins. During the celebration the priest prays the prayer of absolution, ending with the words, "I have absolved you from your sins in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit."
From the Rite of Penance

Anointing of the Sick: Brings Jesus' healing comfort, and strength to those who are seriously ill, elderly, or in danger of death. During the celebration the priest anoints the person with oil as he prays, "Through this holy anointing may the Lord in His love and mercy help you with the grace of the Holy Spirit. May the Lord who frees you from sin save you and raise you up."
From the Rite of Anointing

VOCATION:

Matrimony: Celebrates the permanent and lifelong love of a man and woman for each other. During the celebration the bride and groom exchange marriage vows, promising always to be faithful to each other.

Holy Orders: Bishops, priest, and deacons are ordained to serve the Church in a special way. During the celebration the bishop lays his hands on the head of the person to be ordained. Afterward, he prays a prayer of consecration, or blessing.

THE TEN COMMANDMENTS

1. I, the Lord, am your God. You shall not have other gods besides me.
2. You shall not take the name of the Lord, your God, in vain.
3. Remember to keep holy the Sabbath day.
4. Honor your father and mother.
5. You shall not kill.
6. You shall not commit adultery.
7. You shall not steal.
8. You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor.
9. You shall not covet you neighbor's wife.
10. You shall not covet anything that belongs to your neighbor.
